Objectives:

The goals of the conference is to present and discuss recent progress in studies on all aspects of trilobites and their relatives (e.g. morphology, evolution, phylogeny, ecology, geography) in the fossil record, namely in the Palaeozoic and to examine major trilobite- and other arthropod-bearing outcrops of the Czech Republic and the island of Sardinia (Italy). Workshops on any aspect of trilobites and arthropods are welcome.

Abstract Volume will be available on-line at the conference web pages, together with the list of participants a few days before the conference. The Abstract Volume will be published at the Publishing house of the Czech Geological Survey

Presentations at the meeting may be either in the form or an **oral presentation** (15 minutes plus 5 minutes for questions, **MS PowerPoint 97 – 2010, Windows version**), or a **poster** (maximal allowed format A0).



All talks and a poster session will be held at the Faculty of Science, Charles University, Albertov 6, Praha 2




30th June 18:00-20.30 Icebreaker-party: Podskalská celnice na Výtoňi



Late registration:

The late registration fees of 300 EURO (200 EURO) are the only available. It includes costs of the conference, abstract volume, public transportation in Prague, and lunch during the mid-conference excursion.

Professionals, full meeting: 300 EURO

Students, full meeting: 200 EURO

Accompanying persons: 120 EURO

For each of pre-conference and post-conference field excursions, the fee is 300 EURO (there are still free seats in the busses).

Accommodation in Prague is not included in the registration fee, and must be arranged separately by each participant.

Payment:

Cheques and credit card payments are not accepted.

Participants must cover transfer costs.
